### MORE THAN A HALL

**Our original school building that has been part of CBC Fremantle even before the arrival of the Christian Brothers in 1901. Built in 1882 out of local limestone, Edmund Hall has been used by generations of the CBC community. Every single student has trodden the old wandoo floors, paying tribute to the legacy of Blessed Edmund Rice, whose vision was courageous and enduring.**

In 2013, the building experienced an interior restoration to provide us with our beautiful sacred space. In 2021 the Alumni Association committee and College leadership appointed

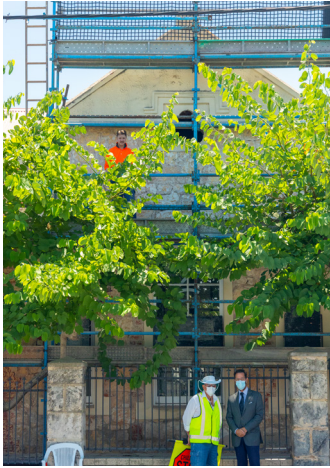
