From the Principal

Recent International Visits

There has been much activity associated with our College during the recent term break. In addition to our Year 12 students being engaged in their exams, there have been two important 'excursions' which support significant programs at CBC Fremantle.

The first was our inaugural International Immersion visit to a Christian Brothers' Mission in the Philippines. Nine students from Years 10 and 11 were accompanied by Mr Craig Dowsett and Mr Garry Hart to work with Edmund Rice Services in Maasin City. In addition to learning much about the community they visited, the participants also acquired greater knowledge of themselves.

One of the features of this immersion is that the students were able to work with the local people on projects that were significant to that community. Working in places as diverse as the school, hospital, piggery or vegetable nursery ensured that the experience was authentic and challenging. As a College which professes a special concern for the marginalised and disadvantaged in our world, it is important that our students have practical experience in activity which seeks to relieve poverty, promote human rights and support local development.

The second 'excursion' was the Italian and Visual Arts tour of Italy. Thirty two students from Years 10 and 11 and three staff enjoyed visits to places such

as the Colosseum in Rome, the ruins in Pompeii and Da Vinci's painting of the Last Supper in Milan. While linguistic and artistic development was clearly the focus of this tour, the experience is sure to have expanded the minds of our young participants in many other ways. We thank Ms Angela Calanni, Ms Zoe Francis and Mr Domenic Burgio for their generous contribution of time and talent towards providing this opportunity for our students.

An education in justice and equity and the provision of diverse experiences are two characteristics which are strongly

associated with CBC Fremantle. Our young men received many accolades for their conduct and participation on these tours and I commend them for their willingness to accept the challenges inherent in each of them.

Parent Teacher Student Interviews

The interviews conducted this week for students in Years 7-10 were typically well attended. There is little doubt that boys place a greater value upon their education if they believe that their parents also consider it to be important. The College respects the fact that parents are the primary educators of

their children and that is why regular and honest communication is encouraged. Thank you to all of the parents who attended interviews at the school.
