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Secondary Graduation (WACE)

THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION (WACE)

The certificate students are awarded at the completion of their senior secondary schooling if they have met certain standards and requirements.

- Issued by SCSA (School Curriculum and Standards Authority)
- To achieve a WACE, a student must satisfy the following

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Obtaining WACE

Achievement Standard

- 7 'C' grades across Years 11 & 12 (3 'C' Grades in Year 12)
- Complete at least **4 Year 12 ATAR** Courses or,
- **5 General Courses** or a combination with **AQF Certificate II** or higher.
- Achieve OLNA

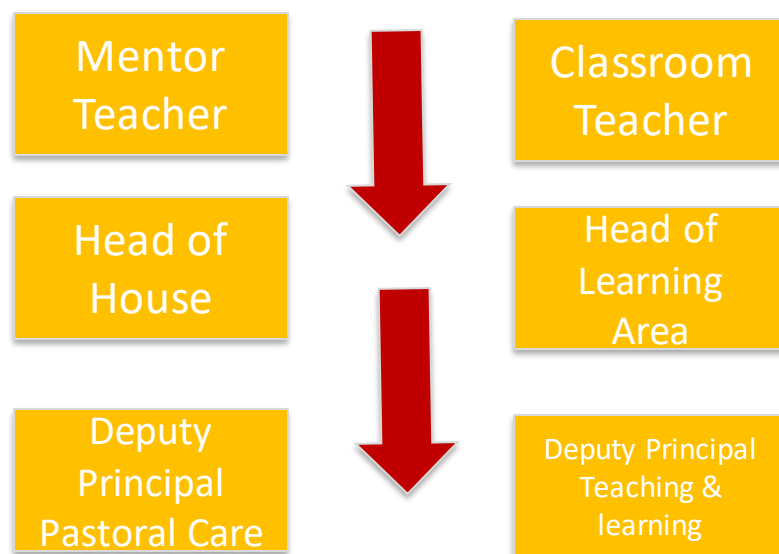

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Why we do what we do?

- Mission Australia Youth Survey 2019
- 25,000 young people surveyed between the ages of 15-19
- For the third year running, **mental health** was reported as the most important issue in Australia.

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Why we do what we do?

- Top 3 personal concerns of youth were:
 - Coping with Stress
 - School or study problems
 - Mental Health

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Signs your teen may need support

- Feeling worried something bad is going to happen
- Feeling angry and annoyed at others
- Feeling sad
- Eating too much or too little
- Feeling tired all the time
- Lack of motivation

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What we do

- Manage student behaviour issues and implement behavioural modification programs.
- Provide pastoral care across the year group.
- Work with external agencies
- Offer support.
- Some boys will stress and have anxiety. We can help.
