COMPULSORY BUILDING LEVY

This Levy is charged on a per family basis. Its objective is to provide funds for Capital Development at the College.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP FEE

This is a once only fee charged to Year 7 students to facilitate a life membership subscription to the CBC Fremantle Alumni Association.

ICT LEVY

This levy allows for the provision of individual laptops for students and the necessary support, software, licensing, hardware and infrastructure required.

TAFE COURSES

The College facilitates students undertaking TAFE courses. These courses are billed directly to the participant by TAFE.

MUSIC INSTRUMENTAL LESSONS PROGRAM

The College offers the opportunity for students to learn a musical instrument. Lessons are charged separately and students who choose to take these lessons are expected to make the commitment for the whole year.

OPTIONAL TOURS AND CAMPS

Optional tours and camps are charged separately. It is College policy that students will not be eligible to participate in these activities unless all other fees and charges are fully paid, or are up to date with one of the payment options listed in this brochure.

FAMILY CONCESSIONS

A concession of 10% is granted on the Tuition Fee only for each younger brother in attendance at the College at the same time.

APPLICATION FEE FOR ADMISSION

The enrolment process commences with the submission of an Application Form. A non-refundable Application Fee of \$150 is payable upon submission of the form, which covers associated administration costs. Please note that this fee does not guarantee an interview, or a place at the College. Please contact the College Registrar for further enrolment information if required.

ENROLMENT FEE

A non-refundable Enrolment Fee of \$1,000 is payable once an offer and acceptance of a place at the College has been signed.

Parents are jointly and severally liable for payment of fees once a place is accepted.

INSURANCE

The College has in place a limited cover policy for student personal accident and disability insurance (by law, excludes Medicare services, including the Medicare Gap). Parents are advised to check their Health and General Insurance policies to ensure adequate medical, personal property and liability insurance cover. The College does not accept responsibility for any claim to property loss or damage incurred by students or parents.

The College will issue a Fee Statement and Payment Option Selection form as part of its billing process. The form will be required to be returned within 14 days.

FEES NOT PAID

The College reserves the right to refuse re-enrolment and take legal action for the recovery of fees not paid. It is expected that fees will be paid within the academic year from February to October. Those families who do not complete full payment within the academic year will be asked to attend an interview with the Principal/Business Manager.

NOTICE OF STUDENT WITHDRAWAL

One full Term's notice of withdrawal must be given in writing to the Principal. In the event of such notice not being given, one quarter of the total annual fee will be charged.
